- [Asian Girls Ignite](#) builds a strong community of Asian American and Pacific Islander (AAPI) girls and women to celebrate their individual and collective power. Through shared stories, they focus on elevating their voices, exploring their identities and caring for their well-being.
- [Asian, Indian, Native Hawaiian and Pacific Islander Giving Circle](#) was created by members of the new Rocky Mountain Asian Americans/Pacific Islanders in Philanthropy chapter in order to build strength and resiliency within Colorado's AAPI communities through intentional community investments.
